





Capital to Labor Ratio (Dollars)





Tools and Strategies for Local Content

How to promote *linkages* and *employment*

Tools and Strategies

- Quotas and employment regulation
- Training program requirements
- Public education initiatives
- Incentives for small businesses
- Infrastructure linkages
- Equity participation requirements
- Promoting/requiring processing and production of derivative products



Example: Contract

The Ghana-Tullow agreement provides that *"in the acquisition of plant,* equipment, services, and supplies...[the] contractor shall give preference to materials, services, and products produced in Ghana...if [they]...meet standards generally acceptable to international oil and gas companies..."

Corruption

- Bribes to access markets
- Services and goods not at all "local" : use of middlemen (e.g. Nigeria)
- Another opportunity for political patronage
